## Modal Verb Plus Infinitive

Did you know that pe peux (that comes from the modal verb pouvoir and translates 'to be able / can') is ALWAYS followed by a verb in its infinitive form in French.

## For example:

'Te vais pouvoir...' is 'I am going to be able to...' but in the present tense we could say 'Joe peux is I can'

## French Phonic Sounds

## OI sound in boise OI sounds like 'WA' like croissant

OU sound in écouter
$\mathbf{O U}$ sounds like ' $\mathbf{O O}$ ' like zoo or soon
CH sound in chanter
CH sounds like 'SH' like ship or mesh


Silent Letters and Nasal Sounds
' $X$ ' is one of the 6 most commonly silent consonants in French. The ' $x$ ' in peux is therefore not pronounced.

Exploring the four French nasal sounds (on, un, in and an). This sound does not exist in English and is made through the nose not the mouth! Words like dancer, chanter and manger.
